The curriculum is essentially modular in nature with provision of multiple entry and exit options for the students. Following UGC regulations, the curriculum has been designed with 40% General Education components and 60% of skill components. The curriculum provides ample scopes for innovation and interdisciplinary approach in choice of open electives and innovative projects.

The students spend alternate semesters in Industry for internship.
